NC General Statue 143B-845 sets out that It is the intent of the General Assembly to prevent juveniles who are at risk from becoming delinquent. The primary intent is to develop communitybased alternatives to youth development centers and to provide communitybased delinquency, substance abuse, and gang prevention strategies and programs. Additionally, it is the intent of the General Assembly to provide noninstitutional dispositional alternatives that will protect the community and the juveniles. These programs and services are to be planned at the local level by local Juvenile Crime **Prevention Councils** (JCPCs) in partnership with the state.
