The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Department of Public Safety, Division of Adult Corrections and Juvenile Justice, Juvenile Community Programs section in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2022-2023 beginning on, or after, July 1, 2022. The use of these funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Youth who have prior offenses, have a history of runaway behavior, use or abuse drugs or alcohol, have moderate to serious school behavior problems and who have parents who have difficulty providing adequate supervision for their children and youth who sometimes or regularly associate with delinquent youth or associate with or are gang members.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

- Peer Domain: Youth who sometimes or regularly associate with delinquent youth or who associate with or are gang members.
- Individual Domain: Youth who abuse alcohol or drugs, have mental health needs and need further assessment &/or treatment, have a history of victimization and who are in need of temporary out of home placement.
- Family Domain: Youth who reside in homes where domestic discord or violence is present, who parents have marginal parenting skills and have family members with a criminal history.
- School Domain: Youth with moderate or serious school behavior problems including unexcused absences, in-school suspensions, short-term suspension(s), long-term suspension(s), or have dropped out of school or may need tutoring and educational assistance.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individual, if applicable.
5. Applicants are encouraged to be innovative and submit proposals that meet multiple program needs.
6. Applicants are encouraged to provide effective programming that includes restorative justice practices.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
